- 4. What does he mean that the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing?
 - a. I don't know, it all makes sense to me.
 - b. Well, nobody expected a savior to die...that isn't how you save people.
 - c. It is hard to understand why anyone would give their life for people who hate them and want to kill them...nobody does that (see also Romans 5:7).
- 5. What is Paul saying in verses 19-25?
 - a. Even the wisest and smartest people are shown to be weak and powerless when we face life's uncontrollable circumstances. God is the only one who can overcome those things.
 - b. The wise and intelligent people didn't recognize Christ because they were looking for something else.
 - c. The entire message of the gospel is that God works miracles where we are weak and think things are impossible.
 - d. Wisdom and intelligence leads us to rely on our own strength...the message of salvation is a declaration of our weakness and recognition of what God can do in us if we recognize our weakness!
