- 1. How, according to 2:3, do we know that we have come to know Christ?
 - a. Because we have said a prayer to ask him into our heart.
 - b. Because we asked for forgiveness for what we have done.
 - c. Because we keep his commands.

What does 2:4 say about us if we say we know him but do not obey his commands?
What does 2:5 say about us when we obey Christ's word?
How, according to 2:6, do we live if we 'live in him?'
How are you living?
According to 2:7, Is this a new command or an old one?

- 7. In what ways is this not a new command?
 - a. God has always wanted us to live in right relationship with Him.
 - b. God has never been ok with people worshiping Him with their mouths while their hearts are far from him (Isaiah 29:13-16, Matthew 15:8-9).
 - c. God has always been concerned with hearts devoted to Him rather than simply following rules, but when people's hearts are devoted to God they live to please Him.
- 8. What is new about this command, according to 2:8 (see also Hebrews 7:18-19)?
 - a. The truth of this command can be seen in Jesus and in us.
 - b. Darkness is passing and true light is already shining.
 - c. The old command came without power, but this one comes with empowerment.
- 9. What does 2:9-11 say about hating a brother or sister?
 - a. Regardless of what you say about being in the light, if you hate a brother or sister, you are walking in darkness.
 - b. Love for a brother or sister is evidence that you walk in the light.
 - c. People who allow hate to remain are blinded and stumble around in darkness.
- 10. On what basis does John remind us about the importance of living as Jesus did, including loving our brothers and sisters, according to 2:12-14?
 - a. He orders us because we do well at following orders on our own.
 - b. He tells us about how we will be saved if we do these things.
 - c. He writes to us because we have already "been forgiven", "known him", "overcome the evil one", "know the Father", etc.
 - d. Knowing what Christ has done for us, he appeals to us that we would respond to what he is trying to do in us.
