- 1. Who is Peter talking about at the beginning of this text?
 - a. The false teachers.
 - b. Those who follow cleverly devised stories.
 - c. Those who would suggest that God does not separate the godly form the unrighteous.
 - d. Those who follow the corrupt desire of the flesh and despise authority.
- 2. What does Peter say about them in verse 11?
 - a. They are not as bad as you might think.
 - b. They are bold and arrogant, even willing to essentially put themselves above celestial beings by tearing them down.
- 3. What is Peter saying in verses 11-12?
 - a. Even angels don't abuse fallen angels when bringing judgment from God.
 - b. See Jude 8-10.
 - c. Somehow, false teachers think so much of themselves that they do what not even angels dare to do.
- 4. What does Peter say, according to verse 13, will happen to these false teachers?
 - a. I'm sure God will overlook their sin.
 - b. They will be paid back with harm for the harm they have done.
- 5. What do verses 13b-14 say about these false teachers?
 - a. They are so bold in thinking that God does not care about their sin that they do things in broad daylight that most people hide because they know that it is wrong.
 - b. They don't just sin at night or behind closed doors, but are bold and "never stop sinning."
 - c. They seduce the unstable.
 - d. They are experts in greed.
- 6. What was the way of Balaam son of Bezer that Peter refers to in verse 15-16 (see also Numbers 22-25)?
