
A.L.I.V.E. Bible Study Date: June 29, 2016 Acts 5:12-20

- 1. What does 5:12 tell us about the apostles and believers during this time?
 - a. The apostles performed many signs and wonders among the people.
 - b. All the believers used to meet together in Solomon's Colonnade.
- 2. What is the significance of Solomon's Colonnade?
 - a. I don't know, but it sounds like a good name for a coffee shop.
 - b. This is where the Jews asked Jesus about whether He was the Messiah in John 10:22-39.
 - c. This is where Peter and John had healed the man in Acts 3 and then been arrested for speaking in the name of Jesus.
 - d. This was a part of the outer courts and therefore accessible to more people than the inner courts.
- 3. What do verses 13-16 say about the public perception of the believers during this time?
 - a. No one else dared join them.
 - b. They were highly regarded by the people.
 - c. More and more men and women believed in the Lord and were added to their number.
 - d. People brought the sick into the streets and laid them on beds and mats so that at least Peter's shadow might fall on some of them as he passed by.
