What is the significance of this gospel, according to 15:2?
Where did this Gospel come from, according to 15:3?
a. He made it up.
b. He is only passing on what he receivedwhich was from Christ himself.
What does Paul say is of first importance for us to believe as Christians?
a. That Christ died for our sins
b. That Christ was buried
c. That Christ was raised on the third day
d. The he appeared to the disciples and apostles after he arose!

How important is it that we believe that there is such a thing as resurrection from the dead
according to verse 13-18,30-32?
