A.L.I.V.E. Bible Study Date: April 4, 2018 Colossians 3:18-25

- 1. During last week's instructions, we didn't spend much time on verse 11. What does verse 11 mean about the new kingdom that God is setting up?
 - a. There is no class system based on race or culture.
 - b. You are a new creation, a member of a new kingdom, and in this kingdom the only distinction that is made between people is those who are in Christ and those who are not.
 - c. We are all equal before God, in Christ.
 - d. All of the Above.
- 2. How do we reconcile verse 11 with the rest of this text?
 - a. Paul is contradicting himself by making people submit to other people when they are supposed to be equal.
 - b. Paul is not creating another class system. He is talking about how we get along with each other in the kingdom.
 - c. Paul is clear here and elsewhere (see 1 Corinthians 8:9-13 & 9:19-23) in his letters that although we are free, we don't insist on our freedom. Instead, we make ourselves servants for the sake of the salvation of others.
 - d. Paul has instructions for both those of authority and those who were under authority in his earthly culture.
 - e. We are in this world, though not of it, so we need to know how we should treat each other in this world.
- 3. How does Paul say, in verse 22-24, that those who are under authority (slave or otherwise) should do their work?
 - a. Do what you are supposed to, even when you are not being watched.
 - b. Do what you are supposed to not because you are being watched.
 - c. Do what you are supposed to do, with all your heart, as if God was the one who was asking you to do it and not a human.
 - d. Remember that how we treat people is how we are treating Christ. How we serve people is how we are serving him.

- 5. How does Paul say, according to 4:1, we should treat those over whom we have authority? a. Provide for them what is fair.
 - b. Treat them as you want your master to treat you.
