3.	 Why does Ishmael represent the flesh, the old covenant, etc.? a. When God promised Abram descendants, it seemed impossible, so he slept with Hagar to make it possible. b. God wanted to do the impossible in His power, but Abram tried to fulfill God's will, which was expressed in the promise, in his own power. c. The old covenant (law) was about trying to accomplish God's will in our own strength instead of trusting in God to fulfill his will in us by his power, which is exactly what Abram had done.

7.	Are we in danger of the same things? Yes No Describe a time when you have been tempted to seek righteousness through works rather than faith in Jesus Christ
8.	 Is circumcision wrong now, given what Paul says in chapter 5? a. It seems wrong to me. b. It depends on the reason that you are doing it. c. Only if you believe that your righteousness comes through this observance or any other. d. There are times when temptation is so strong that we need to flee from it and in this case the temptation is toward works righteousness. e. Verse 6 says it doesn't matter either way!
