## A.L.I.V.E. Bible Study Date: August 6, 2017 Hebrews 4:1-13

- 1. What is the rest that the writer of the Hebrews is talking about in 4:1, 3, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, and 11?
  - a. Sunday...That's why I don't come to church. I'm resting!
  - b. Saturday...4:4 and 4:9 talk about Sabbath-rest on the seventh day, so I rest on the real Sabbath!
  - c. The rest of the promised land that was not given to the people of God in the time of Moses, but then was given in the time of Joshua.
  - d. Heaven...4:8 says that God promised another rest that was not given in the time of Joshua. We won't ever really know rest until we get to heaven and 4:11 seems to be talking about the rest that we make every effort to enter...and not perish.
  - e. None of the above! In the theme of Hebrews, the writer is talking about the rest found in Christ alone. For the believer, our rest is a spiritual rest that we can experience even in labor, knowing that we are in right relationship with our creator. It should begin today and never leave.
