 What was Paul's history with the Corinthian church prior to this letter? a. He had planted the church on his second missionary journey (Acts 18). b. He had met a lot of opposition to the message from Jews in the city (Acts 18:6) c. Paul began preaching and teaching in homes when he had been run out of the Synagogue (Acts 18:7). d. He had stayed there a year and a half while planting the church (Acts 18:11). e. Paul had written them letters before, including 1 Corinthians, which warns them about some of the immorality that they had allowed in their church as well as their arrogand. f. Paul had probably visited Corinth a second time (Acts 19:21).
What major issues are dealt with in this letter?a. The history of his relationship with the Corinthian church.b. The collection of offerings for the church in Jerusalem.c. Paul's response to challenges to his apostolic authority.
