  - a. Paul visited Philippi on his second missionary Journey after seeing a vision of a man from Macedonia and went to the Synagogue as he always did when he entered the city.
  - b. There was no Synagogue (because there were few Jews in the city), so Paul went outside the city, by the river, to find a place of prayer.
  - c. Paul demonstrated personal evangelism and won people to Christ who formed a church.
  - d. Perhaps Luke help to establish the church at Philippi for some time (see 16:9-10, 16:40, 20:4-6)
