- 1. What has Jesus just told his disciples in the previous passage?
 - a. He is their 'Teacher' and 'Lord.'
 - b. He washed their feet as an example for them.
 - c. No servant is above his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him.
 - d. They will be blessed if they do the things he had been doing.
- 2. Why isn't he talking to all of them?
 - a. Because he only chosen some to be his followers.
 - b. Because he knew that someone had already turned against Him in their heart.
 - c. Although he has chosen us all, we must also choose Him in order to receive the blessings that he has for us (See 2 Peter 3:9).
- 3. Why did Jesus tell them that someone had turned against Him?
 - a. So that they could figure out who.
 - b. So that when it happens, they would believe that "I am who I say that I am."
- 4. How did Jesus feel about knowing that he would be betrayed?
 - a. He was fine with it, God had already told Him so it was easy to accept.
 - b. Jesus didn't really have any feelings, so betrayal was easier for Him to accept than it is for us.
 - c. He likely struggled both personally and spiritually because his friend was going to betray Him, but this also had eternal ramifications for that person's soul.
 - d. He was troubled in Spirit.
- 5. What happened when Jesus handed Judas the bread?
 - a. Jesus sent Satan into Judas.
 - b. Probably the same thing that happens to us when the Spirit of God points out the evil that is in our hearts and we choose not to repent.
 - c. Satan entered him.
- 6. What did Jesus tell Judas in verse 27?
 - a. He told him to do something evil.
 - b. He told him to do what had already been decided in his heart.
 - c. Throughout the book of John, Jesus has been concerned with timing. The time has come!
