  - b. Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?"
  - c. When they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away.
  - d. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side and they were alarmed.
  - e. The young man told them not to be alarmed and declares that Jesus is risen.
  - f. They are told to go tell his disciples and Peter, "He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you."
  - g. Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled the tomb, but said nothing to anyone because they were afraid.
