- 1. What is the significance of the things that Mark tells us in verse 9?
 - a. Mark tells us that Jesus was from Nazareth. Matthew spent time on this as a significant point in Matt 2:13-23, explaining Joseph's dream, the escape to Egypt, and the family's return to Israel. Matthew declares this as a fulfillment of prophesy.
 - b. Mark tells us that Jesus was baptized by John in the Jordan. Matthew tells us in Matt 3:13-15 that John tried to deter him, but Jesus said that this was necessary to fulfill all righteousness.
 - c. They don't seem very significant. It is almost as if Mark is skimming over these things to get to the good part.
