c. The knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ (2 Corinthians 4:6)
d. Perhaps Matthew 5:16 explains this parable best.
When this parable is combined with Matthew 5:13, what does it seem like Jesus is trying to
tell us?
a. Salty and Lighty things.b. Don't hide your testimony or be ashamed of the Gospel of Christ.
