  - a. King Herod heard about what Jesus and his disciples were doing.
  - b. People were saying that John the Baptist had been raised from the dead.
  - c. Other people said that Jesus was Elijah or another prophet from a long time before.
  - d. Herod believed that Jesus was John the Baptist, whom he had beheaded.
- 3. Why had Herod beheaded John the Baptist according to 6:17-29?
  - a. He had married his brother's wife.
  - b. John had told Herod that it was wrong to marry his brother's wife.
  - c. The daughter of Herodias danced at Herod's banquet and pleased him and his dinner guests.
  - d. Herod offered to give her anything she wanted, up to half of his kingdom.
  - e. Herodias convinced her daughter to ask for the head of John the Baptist on a platter.
  - f. Peer pressure and an ill-advised promise caused Herod to do something that he knew was wrong.
