- 1. What did Jesus find when he went to Jerusalem?
  - a. People worshiping God.
  - b. People selling cattle, sheep and doves.
  - c. People sitting at tables exchanging money.
- 2. Why were they selling animals and changing money in the temple courts?
  - a. People who traveled a long way to make their sacrifice might by their sacrifice when they arrived in Jerusalem rather than bringing their own animal.
  - b. Money paid to the temple had to be paid in a certain kind of coin, so people would change the money from their home into this common coin.
  - c. To take advantage of all of the people coming to town to worship.
- 3. What problem did Jesus have with this action?
  - a. He didn't believe in money.
  - b. He didn't believe that people should buy and sell goods.
  - c. According to Matthew 21:13, they had made the temple (which should be a house of prayer) a 'den of robbers'
  - d. In Matthew, Jesus quotes a text in Jeremiah (7:9-11) when God is upset with His people for living ungodly lives and then coming to the temple to worship as if they were godly people.
  - e. The temple courts that were being used for this "market" was likely the court of the Gentiles which non-Jews could not go beyond. Therefore, they did not have a place in which to pray and worship.
  - f. Ultimately, people were making it more difficult for people to come close to God because of their actions.
